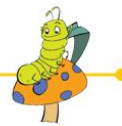

The Adventures of Tom Sawyer by Mark Twain is a story about Tom, a naughty boy, who always seems to get into trouble.



The Jungle Book is a collection of stories written by **Rudyard Kipling**. It is a story of an Indian boy, Mowgli, who was raised by wolves and learns from the jungle animals to become wise and self-dependent.
