 It is the largest river in the world in terms of the volume of water it contains. It is located in South America. It flows through Brazil, Peru, parts of Bolivia, Ecuador, Colombia, and Venezuela.





- It is the highest mountain range in the world. It stretches for about 2,500 km from west to east. Most of it lies in China, India, Nepal, and Bhutan.
- It is the largest freshwater lake in the world by surface area. It is the largest and the deepest of the five Great Lakes of North America. It lies between the United States and Canada.





- 4. It is the highest waterfall in the world, on the river Churún in Venezuela. The water falls from a height of 979 m. _____
- 5. It is the largest lake in Africa. It is bordered by Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda.



6. This is the largest volcano in the world. It is on the island of Hawaii. It rises to around 4,169 m above sea level and covers half of the island.



- These are two mountain ranges that run parallel to the Bay of Bengal and the Arabian Sea coasts. They are separated from the water bodies by long, narrow coastal lands.
- This river flows through China, India, and Bangladesh. Starting from the Himalayan mountains, it flows for around 2,900 km before it meets the river Ganga in Bangladesh.





- This is the largest island in the world. Its surface lies mostly buried under a huge ice sheet in the North Atlantic Ocean. It is part of Denmark.
- This ocean contains the Mariana Trench, which
 is the deepest oceanic trench in the world and
 has a depth greater than the height of Mt Everest.
